- Object-Relational Mapping (ORM) + Database
- End-to-end Testing
- Authentication

Choose a Well Supported Stack

Remix has three official stacks + Epic Stack

Indie, Blues, Grunge

Templates for Deployment Providers

- One problem with a few of them - forks of the Indie Stack, but many commits behind the current main branch
- Might be better to think of ways to setup deployments outside of a new project built from a template - in particular for server migrations

Creating your own Remix Template/Stack

Use the **remix-stack** topic on GitHub

May want a `remix.init/index.js` script
for automatic file creation
